Our Falkirk nursery is based in the beautiful birch woods at the iconic Falkirk Wheel and is Falkirk's only fully outdoor nursery.

Our vision is for all children in and around Falkirk and beyond to have the opportunity to play, learn and thrive outdoors.

Who we are

Willow Den Children's Outdoor Nursery offers early learning and childcare for children aged 3 to not yet finished primary 3. We are a not-for-profit social enterprise run by Thrive Outdoors, part of national charity Inspiring Scotland.

Funded places

As a partner provider to Falkirk Council we are able to offer families the opportunity to use all or part of their child's 1140 funded hours in our fully outdoor nursery. Parents can access 1140 hours of early learning and childcare, with the option for split placements between Willow Den and other providers, including those in nearby local authorities.

Opening hours

We are open all year round and offer full and part time places as well as school holiday cover. Mondays to Thursdays 8am to 6pm Fridays 8am to 12.30pm



Free outdoor clothing!

Children attending two days or more will get a waterproof jacket, dungarees with fleece lining and neoprene wellies from the Spotty Otter Forest Ranger range for free.

Children attending less than two days per week, or would like additional sets, can purchase at a significantly reduced cost. With these suits little ones are set to enjoy Willow Den whatever the weather!





What's on at Willow Den at the Falkirk Wheel

There are opportunities for children of all ages to get outdoors at our nursery, here's how:

Wee Willows

We run a toddler group twice a week on Monday and Friday mornings for wee ones from 18 months to aged 3.

Pre-school

We offer a unique play and learning experience where children immerse themselves in the wonders of the great outdoors, supported by experienced and qualified outdoor learning practitioners. You can come to Willow Den full or part time!

Funded places are available for those aged 3 until your little one starts school. We follow a child-led approach to early learning and childcare and learning takes place in the best classroom there is - the great outdoors!

Why Outdoors?

Put simply, being outdoors is better for children's health and wellbeing!

Learning outdoors in the natural environment enables children to follow their curiosity and to develop their knowledge and skills across the entire early level curriculum. Research clearly and consistently identifies outdoor play as vital to emotional, physical and mental health and well-being and critical to all aspects of childhood learning and development. That's why our founders, Inspiring Scotland, are working to establish outdoor play as the critical catalyst for healthy childhood development and a fundamental part of growing up.

Outdoor free play

We love play! Free play is a natural part of children's daily experience. Free play in its simplest form can be described as child-initiated play which gives children the freedom to choose what they play with, as well as how and when they do so. We actively promote United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child UNRC.

What a day at Willow Den looks like

An outside adventure everyday!

We start our day at the **cabin**- an inside play space and our office. Behind the cabin is our **garden area** where we grow some of our own food, have a small camp fire and our summer house with a stove where we can read or make music.

Our **nature trail** leads the way to **main camp** which is where we can have some breakfast before going for a walk to watch the boats or forage some brambles!

We will have a freshly prepared snack and might gather in our **story den** and sing songs together.



There are plently of places to explore and things to do in camp such as potion making, wood work or mark making. We practise our counting and sorting skills using natural materials.

We can head into **sleepy hollow** for a rest on a bed or hammock, listening to the trees and birds.

Learning Journeys

Children's learning and progress is recorded through observations. These are shared with children and families in floorbooks, wall displays and digitally, through the use of an app.

Meals, snacks and drinks

We follow NHS Scotland's 'Setting the Table' guidance, which aims to ensure that children in childcare settings across Scotland are offered **healthy and nutritious meals**, **snacks and drinks**. We want children to develop an understanding of where different foods come from. We will grow some of our own food from our garden area and cook with the children so they can experience the food cycle from seed to plate.

Commitment to good environmental practice

Willow Den takes a responsible pro-active approach to looking after our woodland site and minimising the negative impact of our activities on the local and global environment.

We seek to lead by example and promote good environmental practice.

Complete our short online form giving us as much information as you can on the placement you are looking for - this helps us to match you to available spaces and lets us keep in touch with you until it's time to start.

4. Get Registered

Our nursery management team will help you complete all the paperwork

5. Get Funding

Full time, part time, blended or topping up your hours - Our nursery management team will help complete the paperwork.

6. Get Connected

Our team will set you up with your online profile to on our online nursery management system Parent Admin



Fees and Funding

Every child in Scotland is eligible to receive 1,140 hours of funded early learning and childcare per year from the age of 3 until they start school.

You can choose to use your 1140 funded hours with more than one nursery, this is called a split or blended placement.

Parents can access 1140 hours of early learning and childcare, with the option for split placements between Willow Den and other providers, including those in nearby local authorities. This arrangement incurs no additional costs for parents and many children use this option. The team will do all the paper work required for this!

For families requiring more than 1140 hours of childcare, additional hours are available to purchase. This is called 'wrap-around' care. A third of parents in Scotland are now also choosing to use their entitlement to keep their child at nursery and defer starting school for an additional year.

When will my child be eligible for funded hours?

If your child turns 3 between 1st March and 31st July they can access funded hours from the new school term in August.

If your child turns 3 between 1st August and 28th (or 29th) of February they can access funded funded hours from one calendar month after their birthday. Here are some examples of how a family may choose to use their funded hours.

Jo lives in Falkirk and will turn 3 on 24th June 2025. Their 1140 funding will be available from the new school term in August 2025.

Jo's family registered online for a place with Willow Den by December 2024.

They completed their Willow Den Registration Forms and Funding Application and handed them in to the Nursery Manager at Willow Den so they are ready to submit to Falkirk council by February 2025. Sky will turn 3 in October 2025, with 1140 hours of funding available from November 3, 2025.

Sky's family registered online for a place at Willow Den by February 2025 and plan for Sky to attend 3 days at another funded setting, using the remaining hours at Willow Den.

They submitted the registration and funding application forms for both settings in February 2025, ensuring to include details about the partner provider and Sky's schedule.

Bobby's family applied for funded nursery hours for him starting August 2025 but are considering changing to Willow Den after seeing how much he enjoys it.

They worry it's too late to switch but the Nursery Team assures them they can still apply to change funding. They complete the necessary registration and funding application forms.
